### **The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity**

The Holy Trinity - God - is a mystery we will never quite grasp. Our minds are finite, God is infinite. Even so, we should strive to understand as best we can the meaning of the Trinity. Doing so will help us grow in our awareness of God, who Christ is, and who we are in relation to them in the Holy Spirit.

Sometimes we refer to God as Father. This is a reference to God as the creator of all things. The one who was not created, but who creates all that is. "God Almighty Creator" is a better name than "Father," as that burdens God with many human images that get transferred onto God. God is not human, we are, God is God.

The most confusing aspect of the Trinity is understanding who Christ is and who Jesus was. Christ had two natures, human in Jesus, and divine. These natures were never merged into one nature, but were mysteriously united in what we refer to as the hypostatic union. Thus, Christ is God united to man in Jesus. But the union of God and man in Christ is also the union of God with all humanity not just the particular person Jesus. Jesus then is a model for all of us and God has united himself with the universal human nature of all peoples and not just Jesus.

So, what is said of Jesus, we pray, will be able to be said of each one of us. We are the living human "Christ" today. So when we worship God in the incarnation we worship the Christ who has united God's self to every human person. We don't worship the man Jesus, but we pray that the spirit he shared with God will move in us. No one was more one with God than Jesus the Christ. We must let his life inspire us to strive to be as one with God in Christ as he was.

The Holy Spirit is the life breath of God, the energy of God, the potential of God, is the living God in all things and the ground of our beings. The Holy Spirit dwells in us and seeks to unite us with God and all God's people and creation.

How this works, the sacrificing of the Holy Spirit, we don't quite know. The evidence of the Spirit's presence can be noticed such as Jesus himself and other "holy" men and women who seem to have been fountains of God's love, (i.e. Mother Theresa) Yet, we do well to dispose ourselves to the work of the Holy Spirit and empty ourselves in prayer so that the Spirit can fill us. This is what the monks do and they serve as a model for all of us.

Meditation, reflection and centering in God are all key, but so too is ordering our lives to make that possible. I love the line in our second reading from Second Corinthians where it says, "Mend your ways," When I read this I thought of a friend who recently purged all his belongings and moved out tons of stuff that were cluttering up his space and his life. Working on such a project not only makes room in our "spaces," but it also makes room in our spirits for God.

Jesus didn't live with any clutter in his life and the Spirit was perfectly one with him. Let us let him be the model for ourselves.
