Amen, Amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father." (JN 14:12)

These words from the end of today's Gospel are challenging. Jesus says we will do greater works than he did. Seems unbelievable doesn't it. Yet, if we understand the last clause, *because I am going to the Father*, we might understand the possibilities of his claim.

The "because I am going to the Father," indicates that the Holy Spirit will come and accomplish through us the "greater works than these." It's not what we can accomplish, it is what God can accomplish through us and in us by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' words are affirmed in what we are hearing in this Easter Season from the Acts of the Apostles. Peter and the boys are doing many of the things Jesus did. Their words too are accompanied by signs to affirm their teaching, and they are having great success in their preaching as many are being added to their number. So with the gift of the Holy Spirit they continue the mission of God through Christ. The Church, you and I, continue this mission. This is why we must embrace Jesus' words in faith and trust that the Holy Spirit can accomplish in us what God desires.

A great prayer for all of us, is to call upon the Holy Spirit and ask the Spirit to live in us, and if need be, to remove what keeps our spirit from being united to God's Spirit in the gift of God's love.

Beyond Career to Calling: The Vocation of the Business Leader, Dr. Michael Naughton, Ph.D, Center for Catholic Studies, University of St. Thomas

A Saint John's School of Theology and Seminary Theology Day

As important as work is in our lives, it can disorder rather than develop. For some of us, work is little more than a daily drudgery, a necessary but ultimately meaningless way to make money to pay bills and fund weekends and vacations. For others of us, it dominates our lives. Work takes the best of us and leaves little for others. An unexpected reason for this disordered relationship to work is the loss, within our culture, of the habits of leisure. Or so argues Professor Michael Naughton of the Center for Catholic Studies at the University of St. Thomas. Naughton does not mean leisure in the now customary sense of amusement or distraction. Rather, he wants to restore spiritual contemplation and education to their proper places in the ordered and integrated life. Naughton believes that our culture's leaders—and specifically business leaders—need to cultivate these disciplines of leisure in order to execute their offices well.
