"By his wounds you have been healed."

These words, taken from the Second Letter of Peter in today's second reading, are profound. Their true meaning is found beyond the atonement theory of an eye for an eye thinking of Jesus suffering in our place.

Suffering is part of life and there are many kinds of suffering. Some is caused by the injustice of others and can leave the innocent carrying a heavy burden. There is suffering from sickness and illness of mind, body and soul. There is a groaning in the Universe that cries out for the Spirit of God. We each long insatiably for God, even when we live good and holy lives. We are all part of the longing of the universe. Our "woundedness" is a perpetual hunger for the gift of the Holy Spirit.

When we become healed by the wounds of Christ, our will and God's will become one, and we learn another response to sin caused by brokenness. Rather than an eye for and eye, there is love returned for hate, and healing where we have acted out of brokenness. This reality is hard to imagine for most of us. We live in a world that loves little and does not forgive.

The "wound" of Christ is all the brokenness in humanity of all causes and kinds. What is beautiful is that Christ without condemnation, without price, chooses to heal us with his love. God's Spirit comes to help us find the peace God implanted in our beings at birth. Let us then, stand before this wounded Christ who reflects ourselves back to us, but let us look up at his face and see the eyes that bless us with his love in such a way that in the meeting of our eyes we know we are forgiven, we know we are healed; we know we are loved!
