The road mentioned in today's gospel, between Jerusalem and Emmaus, is the road of every man and woman. In one direction there is unknowing and confusion. In the other, a knowing beyond reason that is the foundation of hope; the experience of God!

The journey to knowing was not an easy one for the disciples. Their pain was great with the loss of Jesus' life and their reason for living. Then it all becomes restored in their experience of the Risen Christ, and their reason for living becomes greater than they ever imagined before.

For the disciples, Jesus became more than a prophet, he became the One who was raised from the dead. Somehow in Christ Jesus, humanity is shown to be in union with God. The two are One. And even more astounding is that the union of God and man in Christ is to be the model of our own unity with God through the Holy Spirit, to live in God who is creator, redeemer and sanctifier. What Christ has become, or is, is what we are to become and will be.

The mystic lives with a clear vision of this reality. They see and experience God like an artist perceiving the beauty of life in all its aspects. As we grow in God, and God's Spirit enlivens us, we too come to perceive the eternal in the now, God in all things.

I think this was the experience of Peter and the disciples in our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. Peter quotes David in the following words which can become our own. Let us pray them through this coming week and come to dwell in hope as we realize we are in God and **God is in us!**

I saw the Lord ever before me, with him at my right hand I shall not be disturbed.

Therefore my heart has been glad and my tongue has exulted;

my flesh, too, will dwell in hope,

because you will not abandon my soul to the netherworld,

nor will you suffer your holy one to see corruption.

You have made known to me the paths of life;

you will fill me with joy in your presence.
